Artistry's programming comprises theater productions (formerly produced under the name Bloomington Civic Theatre), visual arts exhibitions, arts education at the Center for the Arts and other locations throughout the Twin Cities, and creative placemaking. The following program/organization names are no longer active and should not be used in reference to our programming: Bloomington Art Center, Bloomington Civic Theatre, Bloomington Theatre and Art Center.

Artistry presents *The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas*

(Bloomington, MN) Artistry is excited to announce the upcoming production of *The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas*, taking place in the Schneider Theater January 15 through February 14, 2016.

Based on the real story of a brothel in La Grange, Texas, this lighthearted view of small town vice and political sidestepping tells the story of Miss Mona's Chicken Ranch, one of the oldest and best pleasure palaces in Texas and the target of a puritan televangelist. A Drama Desk Award-winner for Best Music and Best Lyrics, *The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas* features political and social commentary mixed with a delightful country-western score, in a musical that is "utterly charming, lively and genial" (New York Daily News).
