


You've heard of Elvis Presley, but did you know about Chuck Berry? Ever heard of Sister Rosetta Tharpe, Fats Domino or Big Mama Thornton?

Elvis was often credited with inventing rock 'n roll, but he got his style, and his dance moves from the black musicians he studied on Beale Street in Memphis before he was signed to Sun Records.

What fascinates me about *Memphis* is the way the show appropriates the story of the birth of rock 'n' roll, just like the music industry appropriates black music and culture. It credits Huey Calhoun with the success of the genre, instead of crediting Felicia Farrell and her brother Delray with Huey's success.

Oftentimes who tells the story, and how they tell it is more influential than the story itself.


